



## HISTORICAL DIVISION COMMERCIAL

Culturally and historically significant, the scope of work for this Catholic Church included the replacement of existing roofing, structural upgrades and termite damage repairs. Structural improvements included plywood sheeting on the roof, strengthening of wood-to-wood connections and strengthening of roof-to-wall connections. An absolute requirement was not to remove any existing framing.
